
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### **Something Has Gone Wrong**

Although winning fewer than half of the vote, Republicans gained **13 of 18 seats** in the 2012 US Congressional election in Pennsylvania.

### **Basics**

- FDPA: Fair Districts PA
- Common Cause + League of Women Voters of PA (LWVPA)
- Mission: Fair Districts PA is a nonpartisan, statewide coalition of individuals and organizations working to ensure Pennsylvania's redistricting process is:
  - transparent
  - impartial,
  - accountable, and
  - fair.




### **Basics**

- District types:
  - Federal:
    - 2 senators (Patrick Toomey and Robert Casey: both represent all constituents)
    - 18 representatives ("congressional")
  - PA Commonwealth:
    - 50 senators
    - 203 representatives



### Reapportionment



- There are 435 seats in the US House of Representatives.
- Seats are reapportioned every 10 years after national census.
- In the 2010 reapportionment Pennsylvania lost 1seat.



### Redistricting

**Redistricting** is changing the boundaries of legislative districts:

- For US Congress: changes in population cause a change the state's number of seats.
- For US Congress and for the state legislature due to population shifts within the state.
- Different processes for congressional and PA senators and representatives.
- Always political, but conflict of interest can be removed.



### Gerrymandering

 Drawing district boundaries to benefit a party or candidate

In 1812 MA Gov. Elbridge *Gerry* approved a bill that drew districts favoring his party. His map looked like a sala*mander*, hence the term *Gerrymander*.






























### Packing & Cracking

Districts 1-5 were CRACKED



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
### **Redistricting for Congress**

#### **U.S.** Constitution Article I, Section 4:

"The Times, Places and Manner of holding Elections for Senators and Representatives shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law make or alter such Regulations...."

In Pennsylvania, congressional districts are determined by the **ordinary legislative process**. Congressional maps are introduced **by the majority party**, voted on by both houses, and signed by the governor.



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
### Redistricting for the PA Legislature

- PA Constitution Article II, Section 16 (abridged):
  - 50 senatorial and 203 representative districts: must be compact and contiguous territory
  - Unless absolutely necessary no (municipality) shall be divided.
- PA State House & Senate districts: drawn by a 5-person commission: 4 party leaders + chair.
- Constituents may file an appeal from the final plan directly to the Pennsylvania Supreme Court.


29<sup>th</sup> Legislative District in 1999: Ross Township is completely within the 29<sup>th</sup> District.






### **Cracking Ross Township**

29<sup>th</sup> Legislative District in 1999: Ross Township is completely within the 29<sup>th</sup> District. In 2001 Ross Township is divided among four districts: 20<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup>, 30<sup>th</sup>, and 44<sup>th</sup>.








### **How Much Better Is This?**

In 2001 Ross Township is divided among four districts: 20<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup>, 30<sup>th</sup>, and 44<sup>th</sup>.

2012: Ross divided among 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> districts: "..**unless absolutely necessary** no... township or ward shall be divided"








#### **Another "Political Termination"?**

- PA 38<sup>th</sup> Senate District (in green)
- Area circled comprises wards in Pittsburgh- and the residence of former state Senator Jim Ferlo
- Was this done to freeze him out?
- This also happened to Representative Obama in Illinois





#### We'll See You in Court!

- In 2012, Amanda Holt, a Pennsylvania resident, drew a map with fewer splits.
- Amanda's group challenged commission's plan in the PA Supreme Court and forced a revision.
- Amanda's group still didn't like it, took the final plan to court again, failed to get it changed.
- A very expensive, uncertain process
- Doesn't solve problem for the next census
- SB22 and HB722 cover both US congressional and PA legislative gerrymandering.





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

### **How Gerrymandering Affects Economy**

- Large firms have unfair influence on legislation and the political process
- Small businesses lose out
- Loss of local control
- Low state credit rating
- Poor workforce development




### **How Gerrymandering Affects Politics**

- Parties shift to winning and control.
- Power is held by party leadership.
- Rank-and-file don't have much say.
- Legislators fear being "primaried" by the extreme wing.
- This often increases polarization.



### What Has Changed?

- Mapping technology
- Data mining
- Huge infusion of undisclosed outside money





### Why PA is a Gerrymandering Target

- A large swing state, very few left
- Only Florida is larger
- PA is expected to lose another district in the 2020 census



#### Without Redistricting Reform, Expect:

- All out, nasty war in PA between major parties:
  - REDMAP 2020 (Republicans) vs.
  - ADVANTAGE 2020 (Democrats)
- No compromises on important issues
- Ongoing voter disenfranchisement
- Continued lack of representation for women and minorities
- Lengthy, costly legal challenges

#### Senate Bill 22 and House Bill 722

- SB 22 and HB 722 create an independent commission of 11 members:
  - 4 from party with largest voter registration
  - 4 from party with second largest voter registration
  - 3 not affiliated with either of the above parties
- Criteria include no office holders, their spouses, lobbyists, paid staff & officers of political party in last 5 years.
- The Secretary of the Commonwealth checks qualifications, sorts into 3 pools, sorts 40 in each pool randomly.
- Legislative leaders may each strike 2 per pool.
- Secretary randomly selects the 11 members
- Provisions for racial, geographic and gender diversity.



#### Senate Bill 22 and House Bill 722

- Selection of chair requires approval by at least 6 members.
- The Commission draws maps, according to a strict timeline through a transparent process.
- Commission may not use voters' address, political affiliation, or previous election results.
- The Commission holds public hearings.
- The final map must have approval of at least one member of the three groups.
- The legislature and governor are not involved.
- Any PA citizen can challenge maps in the PA Supreme Court.



#### **Constitutional Amendment Timeline**

Requires passage by **two consecutive legislative sessions**, followed by a **public referendum**:

- Passage by legislature in **2017-2018** session (before July 2018)
- Passage by legislature early in 2019-2020 session
- Public referendum in 2020
- In place for redistricting process triggered by 2020 census
- This is fast track- we have 1-2 more years to accomplish this.

#### What You Can Do

- Pass a local resolution: Get your city, borough, township, or county government to pass a resolution in favor of fair redistricting.
- Eliminating gerrymandering is **necessary**, **but not sufficient**, to end extreme partisanship.
- Recruit Republicans, Independents, & 3<sup>rd</sup> Party voters
- Keep on keepin' on. Freedom isn't free.




#### **How Gerrymandering Affects Politics**

- Fewer voters identify with the major parties
- Independents on the rise






- 1. Competitive: 64 voters evenly split among 4 districts.
- 2. Sweetheart: Same 64 voters split into 2 red & 2 blue districts.
- 3. Packing: Same voters packed to create 3 blue and 1 red district.
- 4. Cracking: Same voters split into 3 red and 1 blue district.






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


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




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


(G's wasted votes – Y's wasted votes)/ Total Votes= (18-2)/(20+30)=16/50=0.32=32%



#### **An Example of Cracking**

#### Congressional District 16 (in yellow):

- Mostly in Lancaster County, known for tourism and farming
- Reading is a very poor town with a failing economy.
- District 16 cracks Reading
- Voters in Reading are likely ignored.





#### An Example of Packing

- Congressional District 14 (in green):
- Extends up the Allegheny River picking up towns with strong union background.
- "Packs" this "squiggle" with overwhelmingly Democratic Pittsburgh
- SB22 and HB722 address the problem of Congressional Gerrymandering.





#### PA Congressional District Gerrymandering Lawsuit

- Filed on June 15, 2017 by LWVPA and Public Interest Law Center
- on behalf of Democratic voters in each of the state's 18 congressional districts
- FDPA strongly supports this lawsuit
- NOT partisan- similar lawsuits in states gerrymandered by Democrats
- FDPA's mission is passage of SB22 and HB722



#### PA is a Gerrymandering Target Because

The Center for Public Integrity ranked PA 43<sup>rd</sup> of 50 States for integrity of electoral process, with a grade of F.




